Dr. Jeff Block is a long-standing member of our society and former President from 1988 when we hosted the 8th Bromeliad World Conference aptly named: "Miami Magic". He'll lead an engaging conversation involving the health and wellness benefits derived from caring for plants; and discuss how and why gardeners should strive to get better outcomes "practicing the art & science of nurturing nature".

Florida is an international gateway destination for the world's plant enthusiasts.

This April meeting's discussion topics may include, but are not limited to:

- Bromeliads and pineapples in **European** history;
- How to grow **South Pacific** plants in South Florida;
- **South American** deforestation's impact on medicine development.

BSI has a new datdabase, the Bromeliad Species Database, species only. Give it a try through the BSI website.

## DEAR DR. BROM

Dear Dr. Brom,

How can I find out the name of my bromeliad?

There are lots of resources out there to help you ID your bromeliad. You could start by asking an expert but you will remember the plant name better if you do your own sleuthing. A good starting point is to go to bromeliad nursery websites. The sites list names and photos of the more common bromeliads. Some good nursery websites are:

1. Tropiflora.com – especially for tillandsia
2. Michael's Bromeliads.com
3. Bromeliad World.com
4. Bromeliad Paradise.com
5. Grants-farm.com

If you can't find it there you will need to go to some very good databases. But in order to use them properly you will need to know at least the genus of the bromeliad. Is it an aechmea, billbergia, tillandsia, etc? To help you I have included 2 flow charts on page \_ to help you. The charts help you by narrowing down the 2 ways to ID a bromeliad – the leaf and the flower.

Databases:

The BSI Bromeliad Species Database. Access this from the BSI website. This database is for species only. There are no hybrids. Click on the genus and then the various species and photos appear. Like many databases, there are no photos for some listings. You can scroll through the listings until you find your plant. Some genera have only a few species such as Edmundoa (3), Ananas (3), and Goudaea (2), other genera have many species such as Aechmea (243), Dyckia (178), and Guzmania (214). These will take longer to scroll through but you will be familiarizing yourself with a lot of plants in the process.

The BSI Bromeliad Cultivar Registry. Access from the BSI website. The name is misleading. A cultivar is a variation of a species that occurs naturally and is then cultivated for that trait, such as a green plant that produces a variegated pup that is then cultivated. The cultivar registry also contains the many hybrids, which are mixes

of two different plants using the seed from one and the pollen from another. Click on the genera and the cultivars appear, including photos and an explanation of the origin of the plant. Because there are so many hybrids, the lists are quite long. Billbergia has 1298 entries, Aechmea 880. A few genera have fewer cultivars such as ananas (45) and canistrum (13). Give yourself plenty of time and try to enjoy the process.

Florapix, [www.florapix.nl/tropical](http://www.florapix.nl/tropical). This is the gallery from Utrecht University Botanic Gardens in the Netherlands. It shows flowers and plants. If you know what the flower looks like you can match it to the photos. But you still need to know the genus unless you want to go through all the genera until you find what you are looking for.

Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies, FCBS.org. has 4 databases: The Photo Index Database for everything except Neoregelias including bigenerics and cultivars; the Neoregelia Photo Index Database (4289 listings); the Natural Hybrid Database (152 entries); and the Species Database (4634 entries). If you go to the main menu for each database and click "List All" you can scroll through picture after picture. I have done this and discovered names of plants I wasn't even looking for.

Other resources:

Books – BSSF still has a library of books which are very helpful. But be advised, the names in the books will be dated and may have changed due to recent DNA research.

Encyclopedia of Bromeliads is online. The cost to utilize is 10 euros. I paid and still could not get on but will continue to try.

Go to shows and nurseries and look at tags. I was at a show in Broward County when I stumbled upon a Dyckia hybrid I had at home with no tag.

Plant Snap and other plant ID apps. Are generally unreliable but may give you the genus, almost never the species.

Whether you are looking for a particular plant or just browsing, these resources can give you hours of viewing pleasure. Sources: BiologyDictionary.com; BSI website; [www.Bromeliads.info](http://www.Bromeliads.info); FCBS.org; Hunker.com

## BROMELIAD KEY

1.	Are the leaves with prickles (spines) on the edges?	Go to Step 2
1a.	Are the leaves without prickles (no spines) on the edge?	Go to Step 6
2.	Are the leaves very succulent and taper to a point?	Think <i>Dyckia</i> or <i>Hechtia</i>
( <i>Hechtia</i> are found in nature above the equator and <i>Dyckia</i> below)		
2a.	Are the leaves in a stiff loose star-shape arrangement?	Think <i>Cryptanthus</i>
2b.	Are the leaves green looking?	Go to Step 3
2c.	Are the leaves grey looking with extra long teeth?	Think <i>Puya</i>
3.	Are the leaves like grass?	Think <i>Pitcairnia</i>
3a.	Are the leaves strap-like?	Go to Step 4
4.	Are the flowers on a stalk (scape)?	Go to Step 5
4a.	Are the flowers low down in a rosette of leaves?	Think <i>Neoregelia</i>
4b.	Are the flowers on a short pedestal with a star shape?	Think <i>Nidularium</i>
5.	Is the inflorescence erect?	Think <i>Aechmea</i>
5a.	Is the inflorescence nodding with few leaves in a tube shape?	Think <i>Billbergia</i>
6.	Are the leaves grey?	Think <i>Tillandsia</i>
6a.	Are the leaves green?	Go to step 7
7.	Are the leaves with lengthwise reddish lines underneath?	Think <i>Guzmania</i>
7a.	Are the leaves totally green or with patterns?	Think <i>Vriesea</i>

### *THE INSTRUCTORS*

First up was Barbara Partagas, a transplanted Midwesterner who saw the light as a college student and relocated to Miami. Once bitten by the bromeliad bug, she started submitting entries to the competition at our annual shows. Barbara has been a prize-winner several times over and, in fact, took home the sweepstakes award on one occasion. Her yard is a wonderland of well-grown bromeliads. She addressed meeting attendees about the subject of decorative containers, dispensing valuable tips about the likes and dislikes of show judges.


Following Barbara was the one-two punch of Sandy Roth and Chieng Manlee, who teamed to speak about and demonstrate methods and materials for creating artistic arrangements of bromeliads on driftwood. Sandy is a rare Miami native who has spent the past few decades turning her yard





into a harmonious combination of colors and textures. In her years as a BSSF member, she has entered a slew of imaginative designs in the artistic arrangement category.

Chieng, on the other hand, took a much more circuitous route to Miami. Born in Canton, China, and raised in Peru, he came to this community to pursue a master's degree in mathematics and physics at the University of Miami. A disciple of Ikebana master Naito Nishikawa, Chieng has taken advanced classes in Kyoto, Japan, in Ikebana, as well as Zen and Japanese gardens. In combining the worlds of Ikebana and bromeliads, his guiding principle has been, "The simpler the better."

### *THE STUDENTS*

The presentation was interactive, so members who wished to try their hand at design with bromeliads brought small plants, glue, and driftwood. At the same time, Sandy and Chieng worked on their own creations. In this regard, a picture is truly worth a thousand words, so enjoy the sights of our March meeting program.






# What's Blooming- April

Over the next few warm months nearly all of your Neoregelia will bloom, but don't get distracted by all your pretty Neos! Many other genus also bloom this time of year including Aechmea, Nudicaulis, Vriesea, Quesnalia, and Pitcairnia. This month I included what may seem like a few doubles but they are in fact different. Often plants collected in the wild by different people can be labeled the same but have slightly different characteristics. While plants in cultivation are typically propagated from pups, creating virtually identical clones, in the wild things are messier. Often species evolve separate traits as they expand into different habits or as their natural habitat is altered. Additionally, cross pollination can occur between different species creating swarms of varying hybrids. All this makes matching collected plants with named species very tricky!
