The Cryptanthus Group; Obligated Terrestrials

Born in Worcester, Massachusetts, Steve and his family moved to Fort Lauderdale

Florida in 1962. Over the years some of Steve's passions have included Hunt Seat and Western horsemanship, scuba diving, bird watching, and horticulture.

Steve has enjoyed growing a variety of tropical plants in South Florida for many years. His main interest in bromeliads began in the year 2000. He has been a collector and grower of various bromeliad genera ever since. With the encouragement of good friend Gene McKenzie, founder of the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society and others, Steve successfully completed the Bromeliad Society International Judges School in 2005. Today he is an active BSI MasterBromeliad Judge. He is a member of the BSI, FCBS, Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society (past President and several times Show Chairman) and Cryptanthus Society. Steve is a past Cryptanthus Society President having completed four two year terms and today remains a Cryptanthus Society Honorary Trustee. As an exhibitor and judge he has attended and participated in World Bromeliad Conferences, International Cryptanthus Shows and BSI Affiliates' Shows throughout the United States and also Cairns, Australia. Steve's horticultural exhibition achievements include winning the Mulford B. Foster "Best of Show" two times and the Morris Henry Hobbs Award. As a horticulturist he is most proud of his success as a hybridizer having registered over twenty Cryptanthus hybrids which include; C. 'Thriller', C. 'Eternal Love', and C. 'Love Potion # 9. He strives to produce new robust hybrids with unusual color and markings for all Cryptanthus enthusiasts to enjoy. Mr. Hoppin's personal travels of six of the seven continents include study of Cryptanthus in their natural habitats of Brazil. He has applied much of what he has learned in the field to achieve his success in growing quality Cryptanthus. In 2021 Steve moved to Knoxville, Tennessee where he continues to maintain a varied collection of bromeliads, hybridizing bromeliads and vegetable gardening. Nothing tastes better than a home grown tomato! Steve's power point program entitled "The Cryptanthus Group; Obligated Terrestrials" will include photographs, lecture and cover description, habitat, optimum cultural conditions, as well as, recent taxonomic changes to the genus Cryptanthus. In addition, he will share personal and recommended growing techniques for all interested parties to grow quality Cryptanthus.

In Case You Missed It by Tina Severson

Alex Bello went over the Do's and Don'ts for our upcoming Show. He showed us some of the mistakes from our last show. Some of the main reasons people don't make it to the head table is simply the pot size is incorrect, either too big or too small. Also, the pot may be too tall for the bromeliad. All bromeliads must be clean and without scale or other pests. Centered in the pots and all dead leaves taken off. If the bromeliad has an inflorescence, it must be straight in the pot and no dead blooms.

In our show we have decorative container as well as artistic arrangement. If you are using a decorative container, make sure the Bromeliad is in only one container. Also, it's best to have a container that is complimentary to the bromeliad and doesn't distract.

Alex showed examples of uneven growth patterns. For example, the bottom leaves are much longer than the top ones. In one of the beautiful examples, the reason the bottom leaves were left on was because of the beautiful coloring but it didn't make it to the head table unfortunately.

Alex shared ways of cleaning the bromeliads. He suggested we take a hose and shake them out to make sure there are no leaves or anything else in them.

It was also brought up by some of our prior participants that clay pots are allowed, and you don't have to buy new ones if you properly clean them. Alex mentioned that you can soak a clay pot in a bucket of 40% bleach and water for a couple days and then soak it in clean water and the pot is as good as new.



Located on the grounds and in the garden house at: Fairchild Tropical Botanical Garden.


Saturday and Sunday, April 20 and 21st, 2024!
