EXTRAVAGANZA 2007 by Moyna Prince

If you missed this year's Extravaganza, you missed the most successful Extravaganza ever. **Jose Donayre** and his team deserve everyone's thanks for a superb job. From their selection of a first rate hotel to banquet fare that was actually pretty good, they shone.

Greeting you in the lobby was a breath taking display installed by the Bullis nursery. Really spectacular *Alcantareas*, *Neoregelias* and *Aechmeas* left attendees and the public gaping – some just drooling. At the crack of dawn on Saturday, the plant sale was held. Buyers were ready to beat down the doors at the 9:00 AM opening. Literally. The crowds choked the otherwise roomy venue.

Simultaeously, seminars by four top-notch speakers were held. I was able to catch two of them: MICHAEL YOUNG on "The Artistic Bromeliad" and HARRY LUTHER on "Bromeliads at Their Home and Yours."

Michael Young is well-known to world conference attendees for his prize-winning artistic arrangements, and he demonstrated how he always wins top prizes. In 45 minutes, he pulled together four artistic

arrangements using simple containers and props. He made it look so easy – perhaps I'll try one at our next show.

Harry Luther is a speaker not to be missed. The director of the Bromeliad Identification Center, Harry showed slides of bromeliads in habitat and explained why they will – or will not – flourish in south Florida gardens. There were some tantalizing shots of high altitude beauties that unfortunately are out of our range.

CHESTER SKOTAK came from Costa Rica to give the keynote speech at the banquet, entitled "Chester on Chester," which pretty well sums it up. With the help of Eloise Beach's photographic journal, Chester showed us his beautiful home nestled in the woods of Palmares and some of the gorgeous bromeliads – species and hybrids – growing in his nurseries. Chester has been a renowned hybridizer for years, and we were privileged to be able to grow so many of his creations in our own collections.

At least 30 BSSF members attended the Extravaganza – great support from this part of the state. A total of 240 attended the banquet, when reservations were closed. The rare plant auction, to benefit the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies, raised \$6,400.

Bromeliads were well appreciated that fine weekend in Broward.

AUCTION WAS A SUCCESS

We said before October 2 – bring plants and money. And you did in bountiful fashion.

This auction is a <u>major</u> fund raiser for our Society. Our continued success depends on a great event. And was it good.

John Lazarus spearheaded a strong drive for satiating the most aggressive and ardent bidders – choices were vast in the virtual cornucopia of bromeliads. Use the large auditorium proved not only resourceful, but perhaps necessary as the number of plants and the belly bursting donations of food amounted to no less than 15 tables of "goods."

Auctioneering voices of Lazarus and **Peter Kouchalakos** received good welcome as the society received more than \$4600 groos from the sale.
