Field Trip – Don't Miss the Fun!


Date: Saturday, December 6

• Enter inflorescences in the correct category. If it's beginning to bloom, enter it into the

blooming category.

• Transport carefully—blooms can break.

 Prickly Dyckias, Hechtias, and rare Pitcairnias often shine when handled carefully.



• Neoregelia displays continue to stand out with their bold colors.
